Dayspring Ministries Haiti News Update

January 14, 2010

Dear Friends,

There's been so much good news arriving here by phone and email that I can hardly keep up with it! Praise God for His mercy and blessings on all our people.

There are so many things to tell you about that I'm just going to list them in no particular order:

- + The Trinity team was able to board an Icelandic flight that had arrived in Haiti yesterday afternoon, presumably dropping off relief supplies, The team was taken to the Bahamas! From there they are going to Miami and tonight they will fly to JFK. Welcome Home Trinity!!! We're rejoicing together in God's miraculous rescue!
- + A member of the Trinity team was able to make a short phone call to her family and said that they were actually outside in the orphanage yard, along with Pastor Ronald, his family and all his helpers, playing with the kids when the earthquake occurred. They couldn't have been in a better place. The team was most appreciative of Pastor Ronald's amazing efforts to get them to the airport and are calling him their hero!
- + Although Pastor Ronald and his family are all OK, there was some structural damage on their house.
- + A member of the Trinity team has a daughter that is worried about her boyfriend who was in a hotel in Port-au-Prince that was demolished. They have not heard from him and she requests your prayers for his safety.
- + The Dayspring newsletter that was sent to our friend at the World Vision Headquarters in PAP was returned and marked "unable to be delivered." We visited there not too long ago. We can pray for that ministry as well.
- + Many prayer services were held in this area, including one at our church. During our prayer time, Bruce and I both came up with the same thought that our relief efforts should be directed toward readying our new orphanage for an influx of additional orphans. Many orphanages in PAP were totally destroyed. Even if the children were evacuated from the wreckage, they had no where to go. We anticipate being able to offer our land and building to be used however the Lord sees fit. We feel blessed to be able to provide this care for many children who have been lost and abandoned during this crisis.
- + 20 minutes later...I just received some information that the orphanage facility may possibly be used as a "drop point" for military supplies and as a headquarters for medical relief efforts. More to come on that...
- + Please keep Dayspring in your prayers as we go forth during these next few days and weeks. Please pray that I may have godly wisdom as we make life-saving decisions concerning the use of the relief funds and that all things would be done according to the plan and will of God for His glory.

I'm so blessed to have so many of you standing with us at this time. Please don't hesitate to email me with questions and concerns, but know that I may not be able to answer you right away. The near future may have challenges that I've never faced before, and my email contacts may become limited for awhile. God bless each of you for your encouragement and support at this time.
